

## SCHOLARSHIP OPTIONS FOR WABASH COLLEGE STUDENTS STUDYING OFF CAMPUS



Many of these scholarships are specific to students studying with a particular program. For example, if you are studying with Central College, you will not be eligible for an IES Abroad award. Furthermore, many programs offer more than one scholarship. Some scholarships are only for SUMMER study, \_\_\_\_\_! Students should take their personal information and application requirements into account when determining eligibility for a particular scholarship.

Boren awards are some of the most nationally prestigious scholarships for students studying abroad. This is a substantial award with a lengthy application process and early February deadline. Students should begin researching this award first because it is not specific to any sort of program. Susan Albrecht will assist with this application. <https://www.borenawards.org/>

The CLS Program is part of a U.S. government effort to expand dramatically the number of Americans studying and mastering critical foreign languages. It's a fully-funded summer overseas language and cultural immersion program for American students with a November deadline. <http://clscholarship.org/>

This program provides need-based funding to assist US-citizen undergraduate students with the cost of a study abroad program (and related expenses) in East or Southeast Asia. There are awards for summer and semester study abroad. Awards can be generous. Please see Susan Albrecht for assistance. <https://www.iie.org/Programs/Freeman-ASIA/About>

Like the Boren, Gilman awards are substantial with lengthy application processes. You must be a PELL Grant recipient to be eligible. This should be one of the first scholarships students research. Please see Susan Albrecht for assistance. <http://www.iie.org/Programs/Gilman-Scholarship-Program>

Scholarships for Associated Colleges of the Midwest (ACM) students don't seem to be abundant. Many of the links on the website are to generic scholarships like the Boren and Gilman. However, students studying with ACM should nonetheless research the site for any available aid. AIFS offers need-based, diversity, and additional scholarships for their students. The program offers a very wide range of financial awards. AIFS offers half scholarships as well as smaller awards in the \$400-\$5,000 range. Scholarships are awarded year round.

Arcadia students are eligible for semester or summer awards. Semester awards range from \$500 to \$2,500 and summer awards range from \$250 to \$1,000. The typical student gets an average award of \$1,250.

RISE offers summer research internships at top German universities to American undergraduate students. Students are carefully matched with doctoral students whom they assist. Students receive a monthly stipend for 3 months to help cover living expenses.

German language proficiency is NOT required; the working language is English. The deadline is mid-December. <https://www.daad.de/rise/en/rise-germany/>

U.S. undergraduate students with demonstrated financial need to study abroad in East or Southeast Asia. Summer Award up to \$3,000 Semester/Quarter Award up to \$5,000.

Offered to students that are interested in studying abroad in Germany. Valued at 500 euros per month with free accommodation insurance and travel expenses.

The purpose of the scholarship established by Mr. and Mrs. David W. Givens '56 is to enrich Wabash students' experience in the arts. The scholarship may be used for transportation, accommodations, museum fees, books and other study materials for a semester in Europe. A Wabash student with a declared major or minor in art is not eligible for the scholarships. This scholarship will be announced to students approved to study off campus *for a semester* in Europe during the semester before their intended travel.
